Berkeley Hillel facilities (Reutlinger Center) are available for Jewish students and student groups affiliated with Berkeley Hillel. The building is used for other groups as well but as a JSU and Hillel affiliated group you will always be given priority.

Available Rooms:

We encourage any group looking for space to prearrange a time to see the rooms to make sure they fit the needs of the group. The following are the available spaces:

- Meeting Rooms Two meeting rooms that can be expanded to a single larger room.
 Each classroom holds approximately 15 people
- Chapel/Lounge Board/Conference room that can hold 40-60 people
- Auditorium- this will hold up to 300 people lecture style
- Any other space you might want to use
